Membership Report for General Membership meeting 7 March 2024

Good evening!

This is the eighth membership report for the 2024 membership drive. Our department assigned membership goal for 2024 is 1055 members. Last year, our membership finished at 1,029 members. So, we need to gain these extra 26 members for the 2024 membership year.

Our seventh target date is March 13^{th} with a goal of 90% or 950 members. Our membership is currently at 935 members or 89% of our assigned goal. We still have 6 days to connect with 15 member in order to reach our March goal.

Nationally, our membership shows 903 members processed with 32 memberships in the process. That matches up with our in-house numbers. Of those numbers we have twenty-eight (28) transfers, ninety-seven (97) new members, seventy-one (71) Paid-Up-For-Life, and 740 renewals. We had 270 of the 740 renewals taking advantage of the national online renewal. The balance of the renewals has either mailed their renewal in, used our Post website, or dropped their paperwork off at the Post.

Facility's:

Intuitive AV basically finished all the installations of our cameras, key entry system, network & sound system. We still must perform a 'walk-through" to address any items that may have been missed. Also, we will be putting together a SOP for the functioning of the sound system and other components that require input from the staff & management.

We have received quotes from 3 flooring companies to redo the SQ and most importantly, the upstairs kitchen area. We have some of the tiles that are literally crumbling around us. We will also need to hire a plumber to install a drainage system in the kitchen. The equipment in the kitchen will be removed by another contractor and we understand the labor will be donated to us. We should be starting this project later this month.

You may have noticed that we have installed some additional Televisions. The pool room, card room, both smoking decks, Indoor & outdoor. Plus, the large screen TV in the small hall.

We have also re-surfaced the pool table, lowered the original bar used as a shelf to a more usable height for additional seating. We have ordered 6, 30" tall bar stools with the logos of all branches of the military and one POW/MIA logo. Unfortunately, the Space Force will have to wait, we couldn't find one with their logo...

Earlier, I mentioned our digital billboard in SQ that broadcasts news, weather and digital flyers of upcoming events at the post. We will be looking to do outside advertising. This will be a shared segment of the information that will run on the screen. We will start with Reveille & J. Christophers restaurants. We will have a short ad from their business, and they in turn will run an ad from our Post.
